PRESENTATION: The Nuts and Bolts of 21st Century Digital Dentures (Ticketed Event, \$90) Friday, 9am-noon, meeting room 1

Steve will demonstrate a cutting edge digital clinical workflow designed to produce high-quality complete removable dentures in three, thirty-minute appointments. Based on the solid time-tested principles of the past, this technique takes denture fabrication solidly into the 21st century. Unique digital guides are utilized chair side by the clinician to fit bases, position the anterior teeth, record jaw relations, evaluate esthetics and gain patient approval. Following fabrication by the lab, high-quality digital dentures are delivered to the patient on the third clinical appointment.

Objectives:

- · Understand the skills and techniques required to diagnose and treatment plan the edentulous patient.
- Organize and implement a simplified but high-quality denture service in a contemporary dental practice.
- Understand the procedures required to fabricate a high-quality complete removable denture in 3 clinical appointments.
- Understand the choices for contemporary implant-based dentures in 2020.



MICHAEL S. SPARKS, DDS, MS

Dr. Sparks was raised in Odessa, Texas, and attended Texas Tech University and Baylor College of Dentistry. After completing dental school and graduating in 2001 with honors, he attended a three-year specialty residency in periodontics (gum surgery) and dental implants from 2001 to 2004. He also completed anesthesia training at Baylor University Medical Center and obtained certification in intravenous (IV) conscious sedation. Prior to moving to New Mexico, he practiced periodontics and dental implantology in Dallas, Texas.

Having a desire to pursue private practice in New Mexico, he moved to Albuquerque and joined Albuquerque Implant and Periodontal Consultants in 2006. Inspired by his mentors, he completed a rigorous examination process given by the American Board of Periodontology, becoming one of only a few dentists in New Mexico with the distinction of being board certified in periodontics. PRESENTATION: Maintenance of the Natural Dentition for a Lifetime Friday, 9-10:30am, meeting room 5

Objectives:

- · Present evidence for the ability to successfully treat chronic periodontitis.
- Discuss the foundations for successful periodontal therapy including non-surgical therapy and periodontal maintenance.
- Illustrate techniques for the predictable regeneration of vertical bony defects with periodontal regenerative surgery.

PRESENTATION: Treatment of Marginal Soft Tissue Recession Friday, 10:30am-noon, meeting room 5

Objectives:

- Show the treatment options that are commonly used for marginal soft tissue recession.
- · Share techniques with expected results for connective tissue grafting and non-autogenous soft tissue grafting.
- Discuss the role of soft tissue grafting vs. restorations for non-carious cervical lesions.

PRESENTATION: Principals of Pain Management - An Endodontic Perspective Saturday, 9am-noon, meeting room 5

This course will take an in-depth look at pain as it presents in the clinical setting with detailed methods of managing it. The discussion will involve indications and contra-indications for prescribing opioids and will review current prescribing guidelines. Alternative methods of managing pain will be the focus of the presentation. Emphasis will be in managing the endodontic patient, however many of the recommendations will be applicable to other disciplines.

Objectives:

- To provide information on understanding pain as an overall experience rather than an isolated symptom.
- To provide a working knowledge of current prescribing recommendations.
- To develop a systematic way of managing patients in pain.

Dr. Joy Tucker Trigo is a native New Mexican, born in Las Cruces. She attended the University of New Mexico on an academic scholarship and graduated with a BS degree in Dental Hygiene in 1985. - · Different treatment modalities.


